CLEVELAND — More than \$35 million in major contracts were awarded last month by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration's Lewis Research Center for its space and research development programs.

Included in the contracts were: A \$67,000 contract to Damon Worley, Cleveland for design, specifications and cost estimate for an engineering building at the Plum Brook Station, Sandusky.

A \$28,500 contract to Wilkes and Co., Inc., Lorain, for services, labor, material and equipment to repair, rebuild and clean the Rye Beach raw water intake line for Plum Brook Station.

A \$69,350 contract to Lake Erie Electric Co., Lorain, for services, labor and materials for furnishing, installing and connecting an electrical control system in the Nuclear Rocket and Dynamics Control Facility at Plum Brook Station.

A \$35,102 contract to R G Beer Corp., for services, labor and materials to construct an addition to the B-1 Boiler House at Plum Brook Station.
